How we should behave and why

Our School: What we want it to be like.

Our school is special to us; it is a happy school where most people get on. We would like our school to be happy and friendly at all times.

What happens if we behave appropriately?

Everyone starts the school day on Green, if you stay on Green all week you can choose a Golden Time club on a Friday afternoon (this is always a fun session).

We also get house points and each term we get the House of the Term treat.

We also get stickers and during our Friday assemblies we are given Dinner Winner, Bronze, Silver, Gold, Deputyhead, Headteacher, and Governor Awards, Oh! and the tidiest cloakroom cup.



What happens if we don't behave appropriately?

- We are first given a warning which gives us the chance to do the right thing.
 - If we make a wrong choice a member of staff will talk to us about our choices and our name is put on Yellow.
 - If we continue to misbehave our name is put on Red and we miss 10 minutes of our Golden time.
 - If we continue to make wrong choices we get another Red and we miss another 10 mins of our Golden time and a letter will be sent home to our parents/carers.
 - Sometimes children will need to go straight on Red or be sent to a member of the leadership team.
- Very serious incidents including violence or verbal abuse or behaviour threatening the health and safety of others or damage to property are likely to result in internal or external exclusion.
